**STTG**

**July 2017 Admissions and Releases** – Admissions for July totaled **671** (555-males & 116-females) while Releases totaled **508** (426-males & 82 females) for a net increase in-house of 163 Inmates.

The STTG Coordinator attended a meeting with Arkansas Community Correction in Little Rock to talk about current STTG trends in and out of prison. Assistance was also provided to the Texarkana PD with STTG information to help them with an on-going investigation. Lastly, the STTG Coordinator supplied intelligence to the FBI, LRPD and ACC for the Get Rock task force.

**Inmate Population Growth/Projection** – At the end of July 2017, the Arkansas Department of Correction Population totaled **18,180** representing a growth of **643** Inmates since the beginning of 2017. Calendar year 2017 average growth is **92** Inmates per month, up from an average decrease of **14** Inmates per month during Calendar Year 2016.

**FARM**

**Average County Jail Back-up** – The backup in the County Jails averaged **1,450** Inmates per day during the month of July 2017 – up from an average of **1,308** inmates per day during the month of June 2017.

July weather was hot and dry. All farms started irrigating row crops and vegetables. Hay production was in full swing to catch up from the river floods. Milk production went down due to the heat, however we are still meeting institutional needs. Chicken house #5 was depopulated during the month. We will be moving pullets into production early August.

**INMATE GRIEVANCE**

**Inmate Formal/Informal Grievances:** In July, there were a total of 2,080 formal grievances filed and 3,329 informal grievances filed at various units.

**Institutional Grievances:** There were a total of 570 appeals of institutional grievances received in July. Four hundred fifty-eight (458) were acknowledged and 112 were rejected for various reasons. A total of 478 appeals were answered, 466 had no merit and 12 were found with merit.

**Procurement/Contracts Report (required by policy) –**

For July 2017, Purchase Orders and Contracts in excess of \$10,000 amounted to \$4,556,511.57. Of this amount, \$2,074,060.58 was for Inmate Care and Custody related items (e.g. food, shoes, clothing, etc.). Bulk fuel costs for the month of July were \$26,266.89 – average cost for E-10 was \$1.70/gallon; no purchases were made for the diesel category.

## HUMAN RESOURCES UPDATE

**Workplace Safety** – During the month of July, the modified version of the Health and Safety Plan was presented to three Basic Training classes to a total of 182 cadets.

Fifty-seven (57) incidents were reported to the company nurse in July, bringing our total to 504 in 2017.

**Benefits** – A total of 126 MIPS payments were made in July. There were 104 FMLA requests processed, with 102 approved and 2 denied. A total of 14 CAT leave requests were received and all are pending.

**Physical Assessments** – A total of 326 applicants and incumbent personnel were assessed in the month of July. One hundred fifteen (115) incumbent personnel successfully passed their physical assessment. Two hundred nine (209) applicants passed their physical assessments and two did not. (Neither of the two applicants have rescheduled).

A total of 2,887 applications were received in July. Forty (40) Non-Security applications and one hundred thirty-one (131) CO I applications were processed. One hundred forty-seven (147) Correctional Officers were hired, and 47 Correctional Officers were rehired.

**Vacancies, Hires, and Terminations** - In July 2017, a total of 541 vacancies, 183 new hires, and 97 terminations occurred at the various ADC locations.

**Gifts, Grants, and Donations**– \$7,627.50 was donated in the month of July (strawberries, corn, and library books).

**Inmate Welfare Fund**-balance on July 31, 2017 was \$5,623,358.20.

**The PAWS in Prison Fund** total on July 31, 2017 was \$164,959.95: ADC account (7004822/Donations) \$19,159.55 and ADC account (NDC0500/Recycling) \$98,654.53. This does not include the Foundation account managed by the PIP Foundation Board.

## INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

DIS has been tasked by Governor Hutchinson with developing a plan to maximize the capacity of the state's data center assets, to unify the IT infrastructure for better state government, reduce costs and energy consumption and to improve service delivery and efficiency across executive branch agencies. Collaborating

with Garner, DIS presented the Data Center Optimization Project and its requirements. Garner presented webinars to outline data collection requirements. Several IT staff members assisted with the initial data collection.

Staff visited the Ouachita River Unit to view the new DR server room (DR-Disaster Recovery) provided by the Warden. The current server room is too small and is not meeting the cooling needs of the equipment since additional server equipment was installed due to more applications being added to DR. The larger room will include enough space to accommodate extra cooling.

EOMIS and Centralized Records staff discussed the possibility of digitizing the following three (3) forms and automating the current manual processes:

- (1) ACT 626 - a good time document completed by sheriffs' departments provided to records upon receipt of inmates housed on county jail backup. The document allows sheriffs to either recommend or deny good time for the inmate while housed in the county jail and pending transfer to ADC.
- (2) EPA report and forms - used to determine which inmates are eligible for possible release 1-year prior to TE/PE date when enacted by the Board of Corrections.
- (3) ACT 309 forms - used to determine inmates' eligibility to transfer to housing at a local law enforcement agency such as 309 Work or 309 In-Jail prior to their TE/PE or discharge date. Application issues were entered for all three enhancements requesting development estimates.

EOMIS staff attended the ASOMA meeting in Little Rock to present the benefits of EOMIS to local law enforcement. Handouts with information on the benefits of EOMIS, account request applications, and business cards with contact information were all provided. The meeting consisted of local law enforcement officers, prosecutors, ADC staff, and ACIC staff.

EOMIS staff attended the Arkansas Sheriffs' Association Conference in Rogers, AR, as an exhibitor to promote EOMIS access to local law enforcement. During the conference, ADC staff provided handouts that contained a description of EOMIS benefits, including county jail invoice ability. Business Cards, applications for EOMIS user accounts, and handouts for video conference services available to law enforcement were also distributed. In addition to 29 applications given to law enforcement, 17 sheriffs' departments provided contact information.

- Delta Regional Unit- went live on July 19th.

- Cummins, East Arkansas, and Tucker units – Dog Kennel Kiosk – pending infrastructure installation.
- Ester Unit – pending receipt of construction infirmary equipment.
- Maximum Security – pending some wiring for five mobile carts. The Warden requested activation of all Kiosks at the same time.
- Ester Unit – released by construction to install SVV equipment.
- Ouachita River – Tablet infrastructure is being installed simultaneously.
- Wrightsville – Pending selection of a contractor.

Two thousand seven hundred eighty (2,780) video visits occurred this month. Visits will remain at the \$5.00/30 minutes promotional price until December 31, 2017 and then will increase to \$12.99/30 minutes.

Changes to the tablet project implementation schedule include two phases: Phase 1 – Go Live on September 14, 2017.

Phase 2 – Go Live on January 26, 2018. The priority level per phase is identified below:

**In-Service Division**

Management Level 2 was held July 11<sup>th</sup> – July 13<sup>th</sup>. The Academy held Security for Non-Security on July 24<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup> for contract staff.

LEAP (Learning Life's Lesson with the Employee Assistance Program) seminar was held in the month of July. Some of the courses for this session are Managing Personal Finances, Helping Children Cope with Grief, The Impact of Shift Work on the Mind, The Sandwich Generation and the Impact of Attitude on Work and Life. Future classes are scheduled for September 15<sup>th</sup> and November 17<sup>th</sup>.

**eCADEMY**

During the month of July, 468 ADC employees completed a total of 6,323.25 hours of eCADEMY training. Approximately 10% of ADC employees completed at least one course during that time frame, averaging 1.34 hours per staff member.

Construction/Maintenance**Project Updates****Ester Unit:**

Infirmery complete. Repairs to be made to the electrical for the emergency generator. Installing cameras.

**Cummins Unit:**

Perimeter lighting upgrade to LED complete. On-call architect submitted plans and specs to DBA for new generator. Looked at proposed new School site where the existing Hobbycraft building is located.

**Cummins Poultry:**

Continuing to test Generators weekly. Started onsite work for new cooler. Preparing site, drainage and have received rebar.

**Delta Unit:**

Working on storm damage. Contractor started roof demo and repair on 6/6/17, only working when there is no rain. Materials have been purchased for gym and other building repairs. Repairs started on Gym. Entegrity continuing to work on design of the energy saving project. Composting locations being determined.

**East Arkansas Regional Unit:**

Entegrity continuing to work on Plans for energy upgrade. Composting and solar panel locations being determined. 1,550 tons of gravel for the repairs to the parking lot have been delivered. Working on parking lot when gravel is on site. We are working with Entergy to change exterior perimeter lighting to LED, this will reduce emergency generator loads and downsize the proposed emergency generators. Plans for the emergency generators for the perimeter lighting sent to DBA for review and approval. Moved farm trailer, finishing the trailer porch. Re-located the Farm shop/warehouse, should finish within 2 weeks.

**Maximum Security Unit:**

Working on repairs to boiler. Contractor is replacing tubes in the hot water exchange tank. Barracks 4 utility chase: Plans submitted to DBA for review and approval.

**Newport:**

Grimes Gym roof repair: contract has been awarded. Ten A/C units have been replaced that were damaged by the March storm. Camera crew finished installing new cameras at McPherson.

**Ouachita River Correctional Unit:**

Gravel operations continue. More than half of skylights installed, with more ordered. Damage to Freeline residence roofs to be repaired. Chapel: Working on interior of building. Using doors salvaged from demolition projects. Some duct delivered, remainder being built.

**Wrightsville:**

Architects submitted plans and specs to DBA for approval on new generator.

**Pine Bluff:**

Kitchen Air Conditioner: crew completed corrections to the Return Air Handlers. New Barracks in the former Central Records building: complete, installed cameras and fire alarm, connecting to Central Control. Working with Entergy to upgrade all perimeter lighting. Determining energy savings and costs for using LED lights.

Working on repairs to boiler. Contractor is replacing tubes in the hot water exchange tank. Barracks 4 utility chase: Plans submitted to DBA for review and approval.
